
# ON REFLECTION

Memorialising... the victims of the Highland Clearances



Whilst there may have been clear economic benefits of the Clearances for the land owners, it is now accepted that great cruelty took place at times.

Hundreds of families experienced great hardship as a result of being cleared from their homes and it is now known that some lives were lost as a direct result.

Margaret Mackay was nearly a hundred years old when her family was cleared from the Sutherland estate. According to an eye witness, the men tasked with removing the family were told that Margaret was too ill to be moved. Patrick Sellar, the man in charge, was reported to have said: "Damn her, old witch, she has lived too long. Let her burn."

According to one source, the house was immediately set on fire. Margaret was rescued but the blanket she was carried in was in flames. She was placed to rest in a shed and died some days later.
