
ON REFLECTION

Memorialising... the Battle of Culloden



On Wednesday 16th April, 1746, the last pitched battle to be fought on British soil took place. On the wet moorland of Culloden, the Jacobite Army began the battle already exhausted, hungry and bedraggled.

EXPLORE

As the armies assembled, a wind rallied from the east and drizzle turned heavier. On that awful day, the charging Highland clansmen reached within just 300 metres and were met by heavy gunfire. Government artillerymen fired grapeshot (canisters full of lead shot). The government army had been well trained that year. As the Highlanders continued, the redcoats stood their ground, discharging their muskets then reloading to fire again.

One witness described hundreds of clansmen falling at the first volley. Of Clan Chattan's twenty-one officers, only three survived the day.

One and a half thousands Jacobites lay dead or dying by the end of the battle, the majority injured in the opening moments. Many of them were scattered with their possessions – including dropped broadswords and targes.
